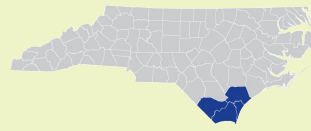

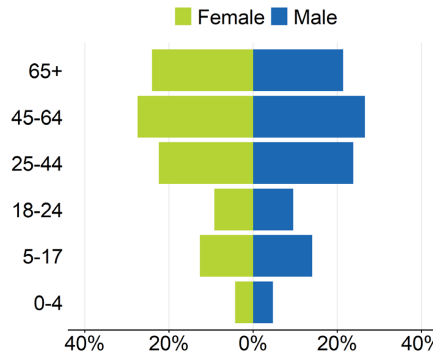

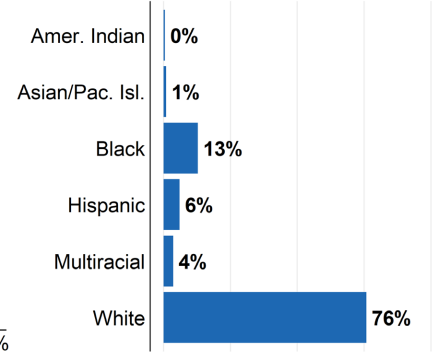

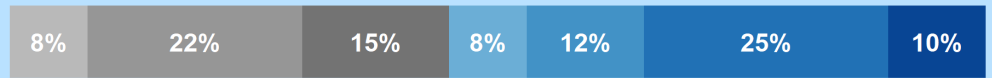

Success of Cape Fear High School Graduates

- **81%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **58%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- **10,895** of all college-goers attended **Cape Fear CC**
- **2,926** of all college-goers attended **Brunswick CC**
- **2,746** of all college-goers attended **Southeastern CC**

Cape Fear resident enrollments in NC Community Colleges, Fall 2022

- **57%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 935 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **86%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **58%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Cape Fear traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Cape Fear needs:

- **74%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 21 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **33%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 9,945 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **40%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 11,499 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **88%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 348 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **28%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 10,175 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023

 **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (328 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

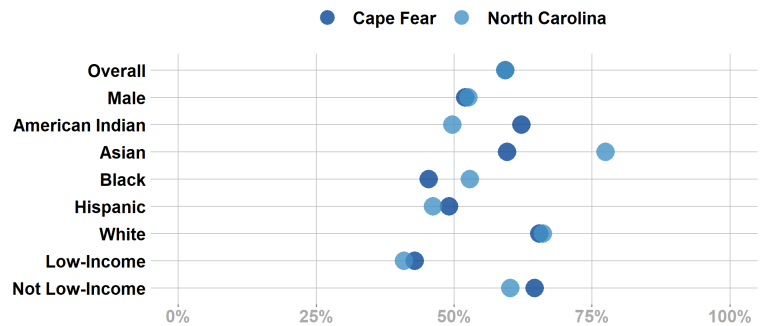

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Cape Fear WDB, 2022

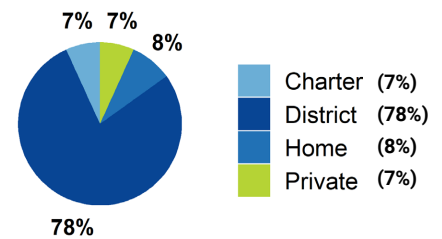

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Cape Fear completed **14,707 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (2,154 (15%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,557 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications.

 **2,285 high school students** took at least one **AP test (13%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).

 **2,034 high school students** participated in **Career & College Promise programs (48%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
