



How students in Durham traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Durham needs:

- 30% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 806 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 6,042 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 7,496 more needed to meet state goal of 86%.
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 295 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 37% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 8,702 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



School Choice

51,227 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Durham in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Durham completed **1,669 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (362 (22%) were industry-valued credentials) and 837 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.



2,140 high school students took at least one AP test (21%) versus 16% in the state (2023).



400 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (17%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
