







Age Structure, 2022





#### How students in Foothills traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Foothills needs:

• 72% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 42 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• **30%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 5,663 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023

• 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 6,718 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023

• 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 246 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 30% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 5,922 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

### **School Choice**

37,035 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Foothills in the 2022-23 school year.

#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Foothills completed **8,472 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (1,021 (12%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,727 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Manufacturing.
