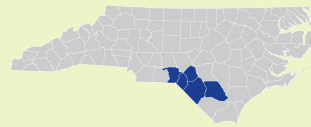

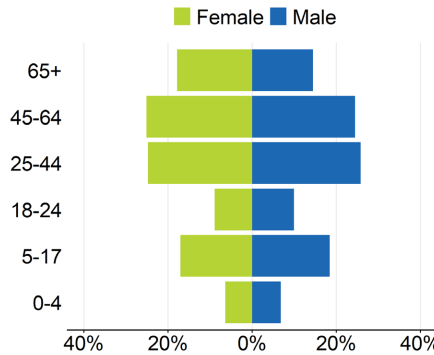

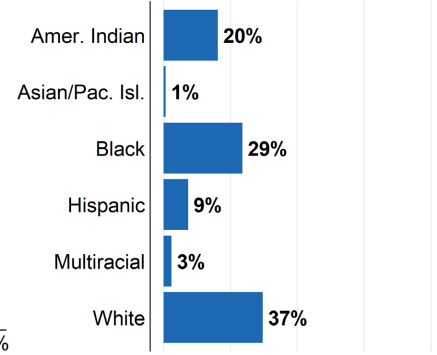

Success of Lumber River High School Graduates

- **75%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **46%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **3,850** of all college-goers attended **Richmond CC**

- **59%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 563 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **68%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **46%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

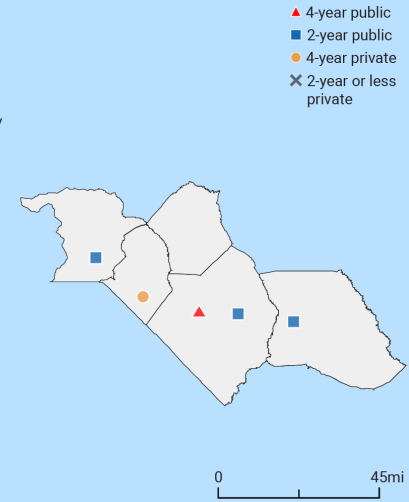

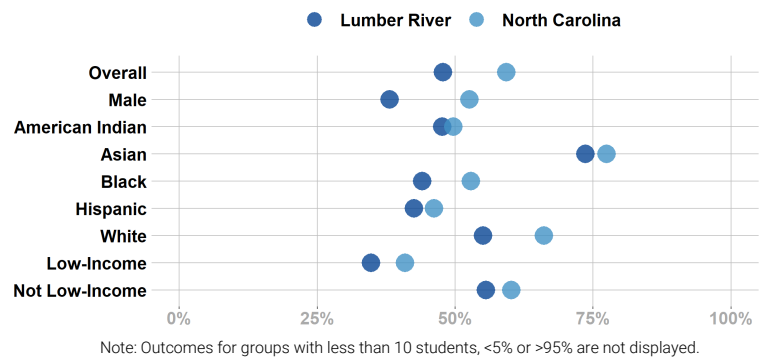


How students in Lumber River traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Lumber River needs:

- **70%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 118 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **17%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 11,526 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **19%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 13,744 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **83%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 431 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **36%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 12,159 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023
- **3%** of students **drop out of high school** (326 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

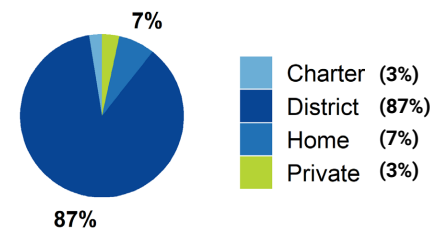
Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Lumber River WDB, 2022



School Choice

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Lumber River completed **14,204 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,257 (9%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,609 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Health Science; and Human Services.

544 high school students took at least one **AP test (<5%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).

1,247 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (42%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
