





#### How students in Mountain Area traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Mountain Area needs:

• 44% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 469 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 7,774 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

 38% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 9,429 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023

• 90% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 175 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

 24% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 6,100 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

#### **School Choice**

62.184 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Mountain Area in the 2022-23 school year.

#### Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Mountain Area completed 6,109 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,650 (27%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,457 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Hospitality & Tourism.

1.714 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (50%) versus 36% in the state (2023).
