



65.6% of adults (ages 25-44) in Bertie County **participated in the labor force**. Peer: 78.3% | State: 84.2%, 2023






Postsecondary Enrollment

38% of Bertie County seniors enroll in postsecondary education within 12 months of graduation, below the rural - non-metro county average of 52%.

62.1% of 2024 high school class completed the FAFSA as of Sept. 27, 2024. 24 more need to complete in 2024 to meet state goal of 80%. Peer: 54.0% | State: 55.0%


Post High School Graduation Intentions



89.2% of 9th graders graduated within four years. 9 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. Peer: 85.7% | State: 87.3% 2024

37.7% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months. Peer: 52.6% | State: 59.3% 2023

Math Performance

18% of Bertie County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural - non-metro county average of 30%.

Bertie County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment (Goal: 75%) Peer: 71.0% | State: 57.2% 2024

Bertie County Traditional Public Schools students:

20.0% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in reading in 2024. 377 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. Peer: 24.5% | State: 29.8%

17.9% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in math in 2024. 483 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. Peer: 30.3% | State: 36.5%

31.6% of students were chronically absent from school in 2024. 367 fewer needed to meet state goal of 11%. Peer: 27.7% | State: 25.7%


Bertie County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 277:1 compared to 332:1 in peer counties. 2024

2.3% of students drop out of high school (14 total students), compared to 2.1% statewide. 2023

Pathways to College and Career

Students in traditional public schools completed 255 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials and 121 concentrations. 40 (15.7%) of credentials were industry-valued in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations: Human Services; Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; and Health Science.



Less than 10 (<5%) high school students took at least one AP, IB, or CIE exam. State: 16.8% (2023).



115 (79.9%) high school graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs. State: 36.0% (2024).
