








FAFSA Completion



NC Pre-K Enrollment

41% of Randolph County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural - metro county average of 62%.

41.2% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program in 2024. 308 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. Peer: 61.7% | State: 57.2%















23.0% of students were **chronically absent from school** in 2024. 554 fewer needed to meet state goal of **11%**.
