




Post High School Graduation Intentions, 2023

ACADEMIC READINESS

54.3% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program in 2024. 390 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. State: 57.2%

Turning Point Traditional Public Schools students:

20.2% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in reading in 2024. 10,432 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. State: 29.8%

23.6% of 3-8 graders earned college-and-career-ready scores in math in 2024. 7,822 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. State: 36.5%


31.3% of students were chronically absent from school in 2024. 7,777 fewer needed to meet state goal of 11%. State: 25.7%

Pathways to College and Career

Students in traditional public schools completed 9,516 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials and 2,048 concentrations. 1,315 (13.8%) of credentials were industry-valued in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations: Human Services; Business Management & Administration; and Health Science.

862 (7.5%) high school students took at least one AP, IB, or CIE exam. State: 16.8% (2023).

1,143 (43.4%) high school graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs. State: 36.0% (2024).
