



harter schools are public schools that must be authorized by the U NC State Board of Education to operate. Like traditional public schools, charter schools are primarily funded through state and local tax dollars and are prohibited from discriminating in admissions, having religious affiliations, or charging tuition. "Charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system."1 Because charter schools have open enrollment and often serve students from multiple counties, charter school profiles are aggregated up to the Prosperity-Zone level. In Northeast there are 9 charter schools and 19 traditional public school districts operating 165 schools.
