

harter schools are public schools that must be authorized by the NC State Board of Education to operate. Like traditional public schools, charter schools are primarily funded through state and local tax dollars and are prohibited from discriminating in admissions, having religious affiliations, or charging tuition. "Charter schools are held accountable through the State assessment and accountability system." Because charter schools have open enrollment and often serve students from multiple counties, charter school profiles are aggregated up to the Prosperity-Zone level. In Northeast there are 9 charter schools and 19 traditional public school districts operating 164 schools







ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Northeast charter schools are currently doing:

- 26% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 1,130 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- ullet 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**; 1,493 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- ullet 89% of 9th graders **graduate within four years**; 17 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- 25% of students are chronically absent from school; 685 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Northeast completed **166 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 23 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; and Architecture and Construction.



262 high school students took at least one **AP course (25%)** (2022).




229 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (22%) (2022).

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCESS

How students in Northeast charter schools are planning for and enrolling in college:

- 67% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2022; 32 more need to complete in 2022 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023
- 89% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution.
- 65% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months. 2022



POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION

- 81% of students who enroll persist to their second year. 2022
- 49% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years. 2022
