

How students in Foothills Regional Commission traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Foothills Regional Commission needs:

• 72% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 42 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 5,663 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

• 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 6,718 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 246 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

 30% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 5,922 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Foothills Regional Commission completed 8,472 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,021 (12%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,727 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Manufacturing.



862 high school students took at least one **AP test** (10%) versus 16% in the




