





How students in Kerr-Tar traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Kerr-Tar needs:

- 57% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 232 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 20% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 6,078 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 22% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 7,352 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 80% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 315 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 44% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 8,946 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Kerr-Tar completed 4,789 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 953 concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Human Services; and Architecture and Construction



369 high school students took at least one AP course (5%) versus 15% in the state



633 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (19%) versus 23% in the state (2022).
