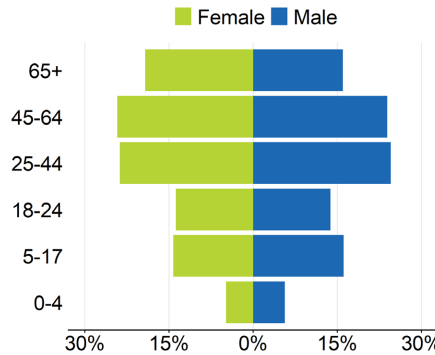

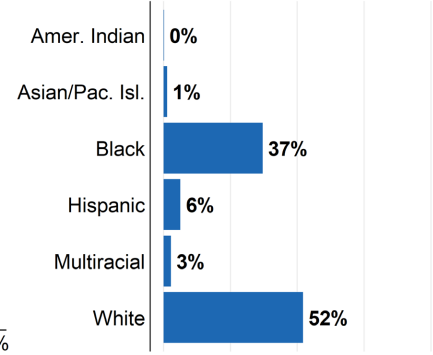

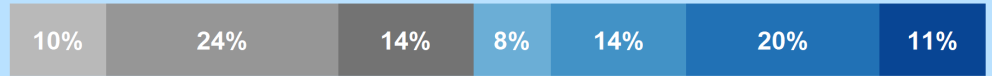

Success of Mid-East Commission High School Graduates

- **78%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **54%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **6,661** of all college-goers attended **Pitt CC**
- **2,797** of all college-goers attended **Beaufort County CC**

- **68%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 275 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **83%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **57%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

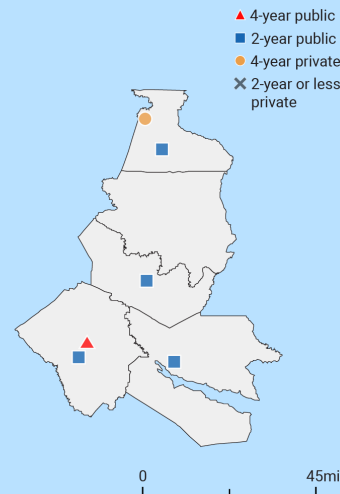

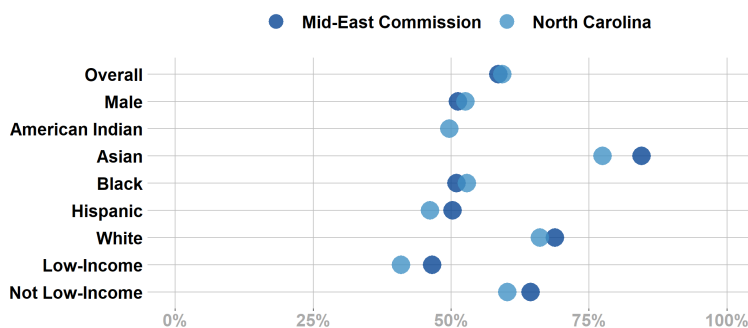


How students in Mid-East Commission traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Mid-East Commission needs:

- **58%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 281 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
- **25%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 7,840 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- **31%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 8,998 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- **82%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 380 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
- **27%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **32%** statewide; 6,106 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2022
- **3%** of students **drop out of high school** (303 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2022

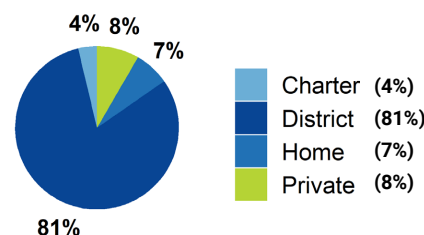
Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Mid-East Commission, 2022

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Mid-East Commission completed **7,225 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials** (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and **1,809 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Architecture and Construction.

910 high school students took at least one **AP course** (**8%**) versus **15%** in the state (2022).

1,837 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs** (**38%**) versus **23%** in the state (2022).
