




• 57% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 70 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- **61%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **68%** in peer counties. 2022
- 50% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



68% of Bladen County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **57%** in peer counties.

How students in Bladen County traditional schools are doing:

- Bladen County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- ullet 16% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 1,153 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 17% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 1,144 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 91% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 15 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 25% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 575 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Bladen County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **318:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Bladen County completed 1,703 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 292 concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.



36 high school students took at least one AP course (<5%) versus 7% in peer counties (2022).



277 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (44%) versus 39% in peer counties (2022).
