Top Opportunities for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Carteret County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Adult Learners

18% of Carteret County adults 25-44 have some college, no degree, above the rural - nonmetro county average of 16%.



High School Graduation

84% of Carteret County 9th graders complete high school in 4 years or less, below the rural non-metro county average of 85%.



Opportunity Youth

13% of Carteret County youth ages 16-24 are not working and not in school, above the state average of 12%.








10% of Carteret County residents have **student loan debt**; 9% of debt holders had **student loans in default.** 2022

Success of Carteret County High School Graduates

- 88% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **78%** in peer counties. 2022
- 66% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years versus 55% in peer counties. 2022

Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- 2,103 of all college-goers attended Carteret CC
- 217 of all college-goers attended Craven CC
- 92 of all college-goers attended Coastal Carolina CC




• 64% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 97 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 78% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 65% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022



55% of Carteret County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **57%** in peer counties.

How students in Carteret County traditional schools are doing:

- Carteret County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 40% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 1,721 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 48% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 1,418 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 78 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 22% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 938 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Carteret County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **292:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2022




3% of students **drop out of high school** (88 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2022

School Choice

10,060 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Carteret County in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Carteret County completed **887 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring **2024**) and **445** concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Hospitality & Tourism; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.



313 high school students took at least one **AP course (12%)** versus **7%** in peer counties (2022).



394 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (33%) versus 39% in peer counties (2022).
