





- 81% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- 62% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 51% in peer counties. 2022

#### How students in Davie County traditional schools are doing:

- Davie County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 1,462 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 42% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 1,212 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 33 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 35% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide: 1.490 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2022



#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Davie County completed 1,927 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 249 concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; Human Services; and Architecture



285 high school students took at least one AP course (15%) versus 7% in peer counties (2022).



216 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (25%) versus **31%** in peer counties (2022)
