Math Performance

18% of Duplin County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.



Reading Performance

17% of Duplin County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Reading, below the rural - non-metro county average of 25%.



School Counselors

Duplin County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 396:1, above the rural - non-metro county average of 325:1.





UNC System College Enrollment







First-time Curriculum Enrollments





11% of Duplin County residents have **student loan debt**; 11% of debt holders had **student loans in default**. 2022

Success of Duplin County High School Graduates

- 77% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus 78% in peer counties. 2022
- 54% of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus 55% in peer counties. 2022

Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- 1,923 of all college-goers attended **James Sprunt CC**
- 225 of all college-goers attended **Cape Fear CC**
- 193 of all college-goers attended **Sampson CC**

61% of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 111 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

66% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

53% of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022

66% of Duplin County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

How students in Duplin County traditional schools are doing:

- Duplin County has met the goal for **Pre-K enrollment**. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 17% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to 30% statewide; 3,066 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 18% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to 35% statewide; 3,029 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 82% of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to 87% statewide; 100 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 25% of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to 27% statewide; 1,414 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

Duplin County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of 396:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023

3% of students **drop out of high school** (97 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Duplin County, 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Duplin County completed 3,651 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (662 (18%) were industry-valued credentials) and 644 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

107 high school students took at least one **AP test** (<5%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).

300 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs** (47%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
