






Postsecondary Enrollment



Math Performance

31% of Guilford County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the urban county average of 41%.

73.9% of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program** in 2024. 32 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. **Peer:** 45.2% | **State:** 57.2%

Guilford County Traditional Public Schools students:

27.4% of 3-8 graders **earned college-and-career-ready scores in reading** in 2024. 13,478 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**.

Peer: 33.8% | **State:** 29.8%

31.5% of 3-8 graders **earned college-and-career-ready scores in math** in 2024. 16,111 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**.

Peer: 40.5% | State: 36.5%

30.9% of students were **chronically absent from school** in 2024. 13,969 fewer needed to meet state goal of **11%**. **Peer:** 25.5% | **State:** 25.7%




Guilford County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **299:1** compared to **281:1** in peer counties. 2024

Pathways to College and Career

Students in traditional public schools completed **8,250 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials and 2,741 concentrations. 1,451 (17.6%) of credentials were industry-valued** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations: Health Science; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics.



6,338 (29%) high school students took at least one **AP, IB, or CIE exam. State:** 16.8% (2023).
