











- 71% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 73% in peer counties. 2022
- 57% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 57% in peer counties. 2022



52% of Henderson County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 48% in peer counties.

How students in Henderson County traditional schools are doing:

- 28% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 217 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 3,003 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 40% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 2,631 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 90% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 51 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 28% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 2,240 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Henderson County completed 1,695 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 524 concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Architecture and Construction; Manufacturing; and Human Services.



469 high school students took at least one AP course (12%) versus 14% in peer counties (2022).



484 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (26%) versus 23% in peer counties (2022).
