



First-time Curriculum Enrollments











Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Iredell-Statesville Schools, 2022





Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022







Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Mooresville Graded School District, 2022




