






First-time Curriculum Enrollments



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Macon County, 2022 54% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 74 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Macon County completed 846 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (192 (23%) were industry-valued credentials) and 209 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Manufacturing.


Macon County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 430:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023


