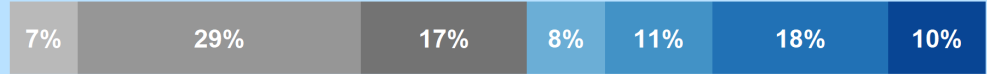

Top Opportunities for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Pasquotank County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Earning College Credit in High School

29% of Pasquotank County graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs, below the rural - non-metro county average of 51%. Also, <5% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 8%.



High School Graduation

76% of Pasquotank County 9th graders complete high school in 4 years or less, below the rural - non-metro county average of 85%.



Math Performance

21% of Pasquotank County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.

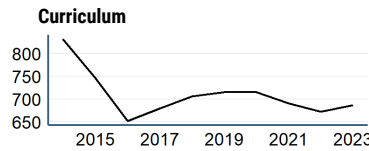

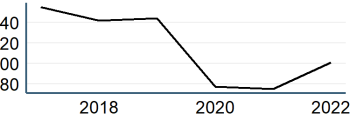

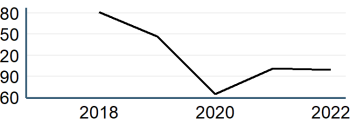

First-time Curriculum Enrollments



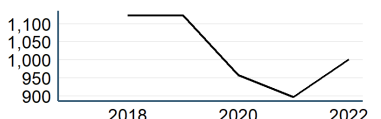

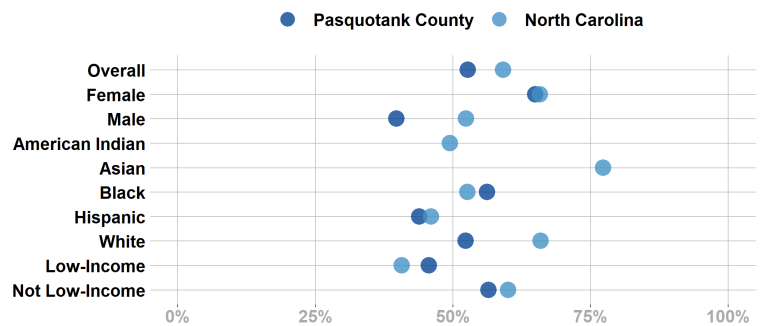
54% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 69 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

77% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

51% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022

52% of Pasquotank County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

ACADEMIC READINESS

How students in Pasquotank County traditional schools are doing:

Pasquotank County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023

21% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 1,304 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

21% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 1,298 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

76% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 74 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 988 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

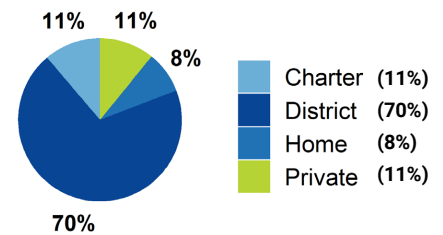
Pasquotank County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 305:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023

4% of students drop out of high school (53 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023

School Choice

6,621 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Pasquotank County in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Pasquotank County completed 2,483 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (168 (7%) were industry-valued credentials) and 212 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Human Services; and Health Science.

60 high school students took at least one AP test (<5%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).

85 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (29%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
