


First-time Curriculum Enrollments


74% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 89 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

How students in Pitt County traditional schools are doing:

- 51% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 253 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4) or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 6,261 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 36% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 5,399 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 82% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 243 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 25% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 3,380 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Pitt County completed 6,020 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,197 (20%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,358 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science: Human Services: and Architecture and Construction.



832 high school students took at least one AP test (11%) versus 15% in peer counties (2023).



895 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (56%) versus 39% in peer counties (2023).
