#### **NC Pre-K Enrollment**

46% of Randolph County eligible 4-year-olds are enrolled in NC Pre-K, below the rural - metro county average of 59%.



#### **Earning College Credit in High School**

25% of Randolph County graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs, below the rural - metro county average of 31%. Also, 7% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 7%.


#### **NC Community College Enrollment**











Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Randolph County School System, 2022








Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022









#### Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Asheboro City Schools, 2022




