
• 69% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 54 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 78% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022
- **52**% of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **52**% in peer counties. 2022



55% of Rutherford County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **57%** in peer counties.

How students in Rutherford County traditional schools are doing:

- 63% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 48 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 1,817 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 1,703 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 89% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 36 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 47% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 2,799 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Rutherford County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **276:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Rutherford County completed **1,978 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 384 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Hospitality & Tourism.



97 high school students took at least one AP course (<5%) versus 7% in peer counties (2022).



390 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (37%)** versus **39%** in peer counties (2022).
