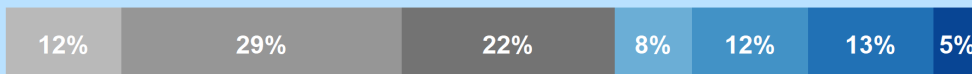

Top Opportunities for Growth

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Rutherford County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Chronic Absenteeism

38% of Rutherford County students are chronically absent from school, above the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.



Adult Learners

22% of Rutherford County adults 25-44 have some college, no degree, above the rural - non-metro county average of 16%.



Earning College Credit in High School

45% of Rutherford County graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs, below the rural - non-metro county average of 51%. Also, 7% of high school students took at least one AP exam, below the peer county average of 8%.

Promising Attainment Practices

The new **Promising Attainment Practices Database** is a curated, searchable, and filterable collection of about 250 county, region, and state-level initiatives and programs that directly address various components of the state's attainment challenge. 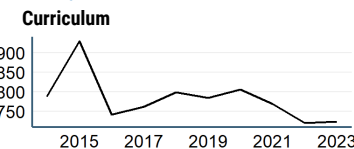

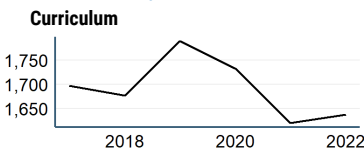

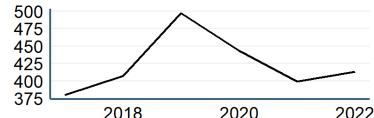

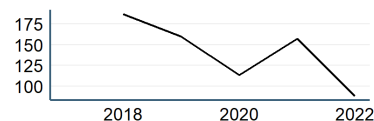
NC Community College Enrollment



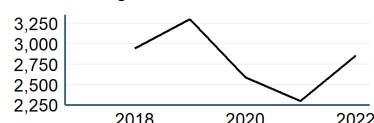
First-time Curriculum Enrollments

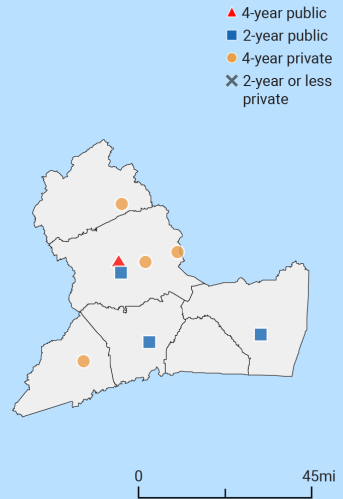

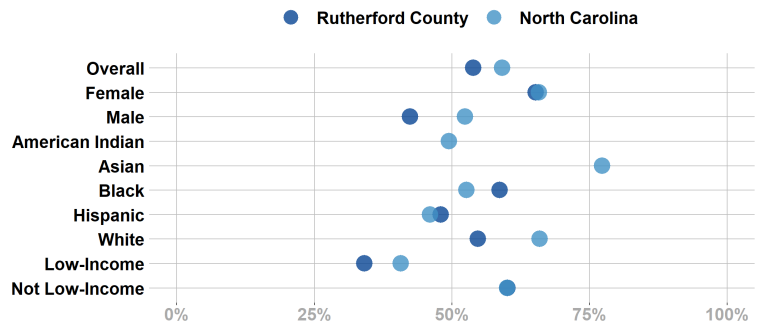
• 69% of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 54 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

• 78% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022

• 52% of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022

 55% of Rutherford County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

How students in Rutherford County traditional schools are doing:


• 63% of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to 53% statewide; 48 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023

• 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to 30% statewide; 1,817 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023

• 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to 35% statewide; 1,703 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023

• 89% of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to 87% statewide; 36 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

• 38% of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to 27% statewide; 2,083 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

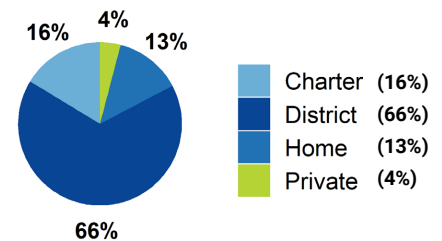
 Rutherford County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of 276:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023

 1% of students **drop out of high school** (18 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Rutherford County completed 2,795 **Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials** (166 (6%) were industry-valued credentials) and 475 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Hospitality & Tourism.

 143 high school students took at least one **AP test** (7%) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).

 240 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs** (45%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
