81% of Sampson County 9th graders complete high school in 4 years or less, below the rural non-metro county average of 85%.



School Counselors

54% of Sampson County high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary earn a degree or credential within 6 years, below the state average of 59%.











Postsecondary Enrollment Rates (within 12 months) for Select Groups in Sampson County Schools, 2022





Percentage of students enrolled in North Carolina postsecondary institution who graduate within 6 years of enrollment, 2022






