These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Transylvania County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Adult Learners

19% of Transylvania County adults 25-44 have some college, no degree, above the rural - non-metro county average of 16%.



High School Graduation

84% of Transylvania County 9th graders complete high school in 4 years or less, below the rural - non-metro county average of 85%.



Transition to Postsecondary

55% of Transylvania County seniors enroll in postsecondary within 12 months of graduation, below the state average of 58%.

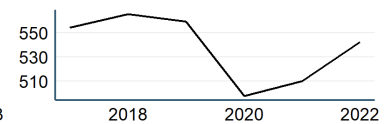

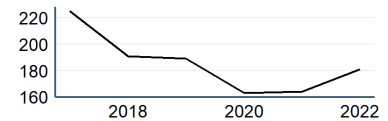

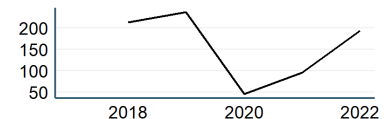

First-time Curriculum Enrollments



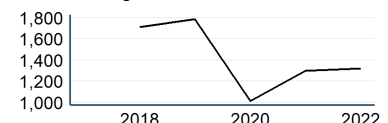

 **9%** of Transylvania County residents have **student loan debt**; **7%** of debt holders had **student loans in default**. 2022

Success of Transylvania County High School Graduates

- **83%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **78%** in peer counties. 2022
- **60%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **55%** in peer counties. 2022


Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- **1,156** of all college-goers attended **Blue Ridge CC**
- **116** of all college-goers attended **Asheville-Buncombe TCC**
- **52** of all college-goers attended **Brevard College**

• **71%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 20 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023

• **70%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **68%** in peer counties. 2022

• **55%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **52%** in peer counties. 2022

 **54%** of Transylvania County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **55%** in peer counties.

How students in Transylvania County traditional schools are doing:


• Transylvania County has met the goal for **Pre-K enrollment**. (Goal: **75%**). 2023

• **32%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 770 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023

• **35%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 732 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023

• **84%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 27 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023

• **25%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **27%** statewide; 485 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2023

 Transylvania County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **285:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2023

 **3%** of students **drop out of high school** (29 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2023

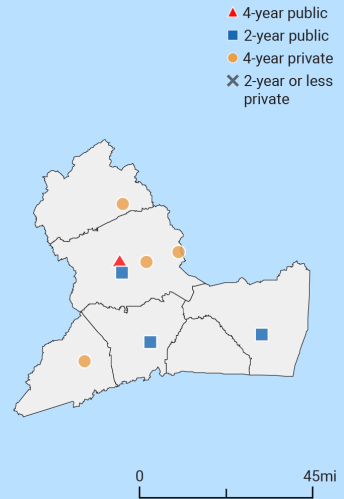

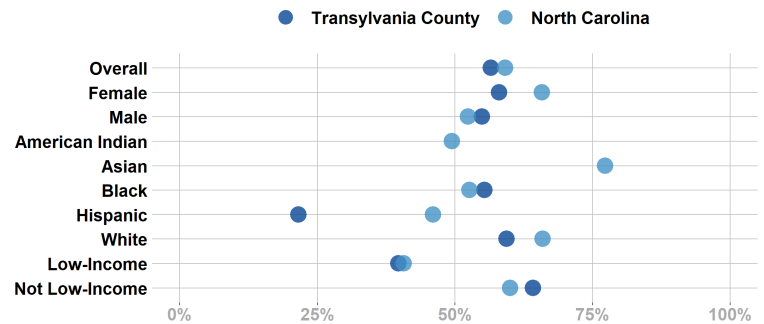

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Transylvania County, 2022

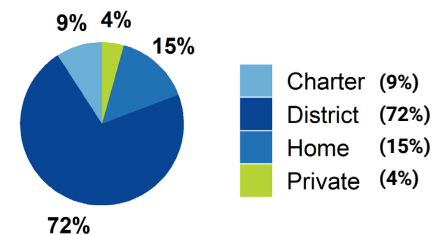

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Transylvania County completed **1,884 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (370 (20%) were industry-valued credentials)** and **216 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Architecture and Construction; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Hospitality & Tourism.

 **136 high school students** took at least one **AP test (13%)** versus **8%** in peer counties (2023).

 **127 high school students** participated in **Career & College Promise programs (59%)** versus **51%** in peer counties (2023).
