



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Tyrrell County completed **215 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (**109 (51%) were industry-valued credentials) and 55 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Manufacturing; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

Less than 10 high school students took at least one AP test (NA) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).



37 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (74%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).

 76% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 2 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

• **63%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **68%** in peer counties. 2022

• **47%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **52%** in peer counties. 2022

46% of Tyrrell County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus **55%** in peer counties.

How students in Tyrrell County traditional schools are doing:

- Tyrrell County has met the goal for Pre-K enrollment. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 124 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023

- 21% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 127 more needed to meet state goal of 86% . 2023

• 94% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 0 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023

- 34% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 112 less needed to meet state goal of 11% 2023



Tyrrell County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of **155:1** versus **325:1** in peer counties. 2023



1% of students drop out of high school (3 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023
