

These three areas represent the biggest opportunities for Tyrrell County to improve future attainment outcomes.



Math Performance

21% of Tyrrell County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Math, below the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.



Chronic Absenteeism

34% of Tyrrell County students are chronically absent from school, above the rural - non-metro county average of 29%.



Reading Performance

23% of Tyrrell County 3-8 graders earn college-and-career-ready scores in Reading, below the rural - non-metro county average of 25%.








NC Community College Enrollment




First-time Curriculum Enrollments

 12% of Tyrrell County residents have **student loan debt**; 0% of debt holders had **student loans in default**. 2022

Success of Tyrrell County High School Graduates

- 80% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus 78% in peer counties. 2022
- 54% of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus 55% in peer counties. 2022


Top destinations of all college-goers, Fall 2023

- 108 of all college-goers attended **Beaufort County CC**
- 27 of all college-goers attended **College of The Albemarle**
- 11 of all college-goers attended **Martin CC**

76% of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 2 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023


63% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus 68% in peer counties. 2022


47% of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus 52% in peer counties. 2022

 46% of Tyrrell County students have **parents with no college degree** (either 2- or 4-year) versus 55% in peer counties.

How students in Tyrrell County traditional schools are doing:

- Tyrrell County has met the goal for **Pre-K enrollment**. (Goal: 75%). 2023
- 23% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to 30% statewide; 124 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 21% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to 35% statewide; 127 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 94% of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to 87% statewide; 0 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 34% of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to 27% statewide; 112 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023

 Tyrrell County has a **student-to-school counselor ratio** of 155:1 versus 325:1 in peer counties. 2023

 1% of students **drop out of high school** (3 total students), compared to 2% statewide. 2023



Postsecondary Enrollment Rates for Select Groups in Tyrrell County, 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Tyrrell County completed 215 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (109 (51%) were industry-valued credentials) and 55 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Manufacturing; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.

 Less than 10 high school students took at least one AP test (NA) versus 8% in peer counties (2023).

 37 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (74%) versus 51% in peer counties (2023).
