





60% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 1,077 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- 73% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- 55% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Northwest traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Northwest needs:

- 67% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 242 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 29% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 14,880 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 37% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 16,860 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 87% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 514 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 23% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 9,728 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



School Choice

92,315 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Northwest in the 2022-23 school year.

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Northwest completed **32,348 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials **(5,234 (16%) were industry-valued credentials) and 4,125** concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Architecture and Construction.



2,372 high school students took at least one AP test (10%) versus 16% in the state (2023).



3,043 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (54%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
