



60% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 4,708 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- 78% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **59%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Southwest traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Southwest needs:

- 43% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 3,463 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- **32%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 62,923 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 39% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 72,232 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 86% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 2,514 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 68,446 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Southwest completed **48,859 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 13,520 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Hospitality & Tourism; and Human Services.



18,371 high school students took at least one AP course (18%) versus 15% in the state (2022).



9,362 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (20%) versus 23% in the state (2022).
