





• 57% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 935 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- · 86% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 74% in the state, 2022
- 58% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Cape Fear traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Cape Fear needs:

- 74% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 21 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 33% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading, compared to 30% statewide; 9,945 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 40% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 11,499 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 88% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 348 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 11,493 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Cape Fear completed 12,934 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 1,844 concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Architecture and Construction.



2,235 high school students took at least one AP course (13%) versus 15% in the state (2022).



2,615 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (33%) versus 23% in the state (2022).
