

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Centralina completed 35,686 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (8,659 (24%) were industry-valued credentials) and 7,345 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Human Services; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.
