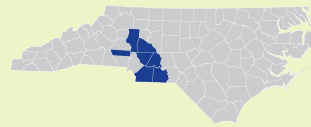

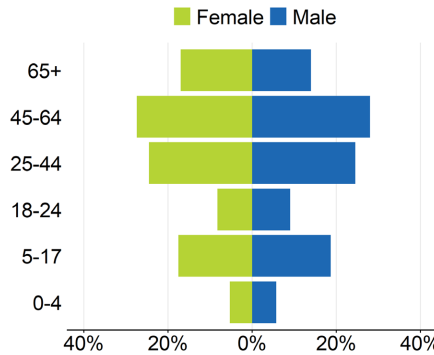

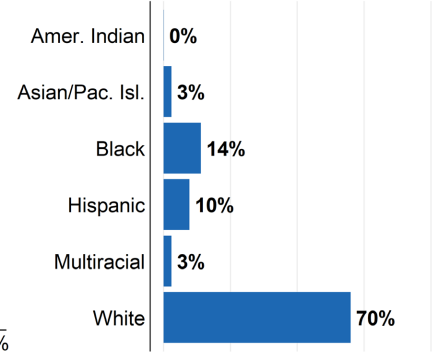

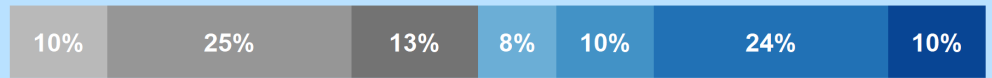

### Success of Centralina High School Graduates

- **82%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **63%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **61%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 2,107 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **79%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **59%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

### How students in Centralina traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Centralina needs:

- **51%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 935 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
  - **34%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 26,188 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
  - **41%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 30,181 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
  - **89%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 697 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
  - **29%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **32%** statewide; 28,075 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2022
-  **2%** of students **drop out of high school** (980 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2022

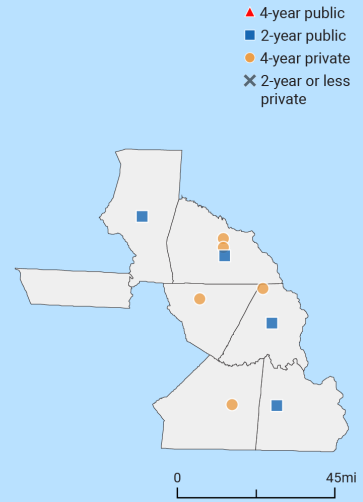

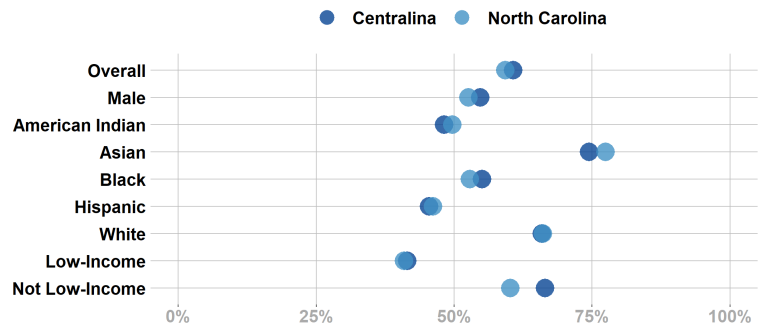

### Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Centralina WDB, 2022

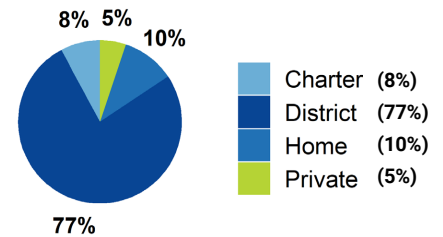

193,345 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Centralina in the 2022-23 school year.

### Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Centralina completed **29,607 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials** (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and **6,758 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Health Science; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Human Services.



**7,119 high school students** took at least one **AP course** (**15%**) versus **15%** in the state (2022).



**5,465 high school students** participated in **Career & College Promise programs** (**25%**) versus **23%** in the state (2022).
