





• 61% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 1,908 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- **79%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- 61% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Charlotte Works traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Charlotte Works needs:

- 28% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 2,393 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- **30%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 27,448 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 38% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to 35% statewide; 31,184 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2023
- 83% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 1,445 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 32% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 31,124 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Charlotte Works completed **8,981 Career & Technical Education (CTE)** credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and **4,293** concentrations in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Hospitality & Tourism; Marketing; and Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics



9,614 high school students took at least one AP course (22%) versus 15% in the state (2022).



2,322 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (12%)** versus **23%** in the state (2022).
