



• 61% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 405 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- 81% of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- 53% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Durham traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Durham needs:

- 30% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 806 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 28% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 6,042 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 30% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 7,496 more needed to meet state goal of 86%.
- 84% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 295 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 41% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 32% statewide; 10,045 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2022



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Durham completed **822 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 900 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics; Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; and Hospitality & Tourism.



1,926 high school students took at least one AP course (19%) versus 15% in the state (2022).



580 high school students participated in **Career & College Promise programs (13%)** versus **23%** in the state (2022).
