



- 60% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 384 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.
- 74% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 74% in the state. 2022
- 53% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Foothills traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Foothills needs:

- 72% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 42 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- **30**% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30**% statewide; 5,663 more needed to meet state goal of **73%.** 2023
- 35% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 6,718 more needed to meet state goal of 86%.
- 85% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 246 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 30% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 5,922 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Foothills completed **8,472 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,021 (12%) were industry-valued credentials) and 1,727 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; and Manufacturing.



862 high school students took at least one AP test (10%) versus 16% in the state (2023).



1,088 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (52%) versus 36% in the state (2023).
