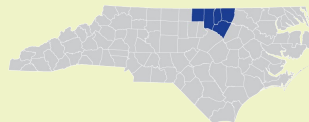

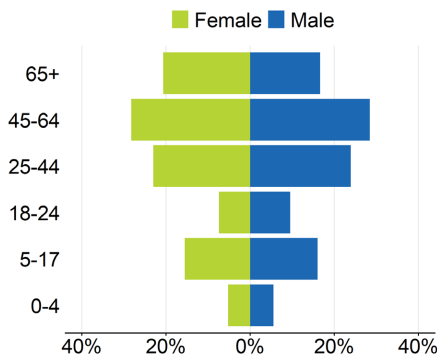

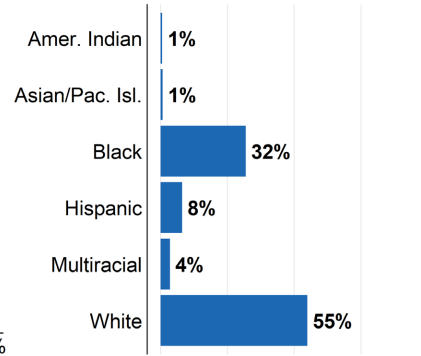

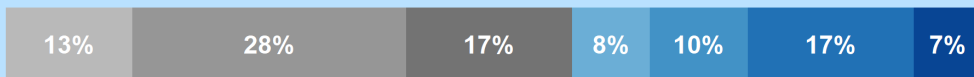

Success of Kerr-Tar High School Graduates

- **77%** of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus **83%** for the state. 2022
- **53%** of students who enroll **earn a degree or certificate** within 6 years versus **59%** for the state. 2022

- **4,006** of all college-goers attended **Vance-Granville CC**
- **1,354** of all college-goers attended **Piedmont CC**
- **1,183** of all college-goers attended **Wake TCC**

- **61%** of seniors **completed the FAFSA** in 2023, compared to **62%** statewide; 277 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of **80%**. 2023
- **74%** of graduates reported **intentions to enroll** in a postsecondary institution versus **74%** in the state. 2022
- **47%** of graduates **enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within 12 months versus **58%** in the state. 2022

How students in Kerr-Tar traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Kerr-Tar needs:

- **57%** of eligible 4-year-olds **enrolled in NC Pre-K program**, compared to **53%** statewide; 232 more needed to meet state goal of **75%**. 2023
 - **20%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 6,078 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
 - **22%** of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 7,352 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
 - **80%** of 9th graders **graduate within four years**, compared to **87%** statewide; 315 more needed to meet state goal of **95%**. 2023
 - **44%** of students are **chronically absent from school**, compared to **32%** statewide; 8,946 less needed to meet state goal of **11%**. 2022
-  **3%** of students **drop out of high school** (271 total students), compared to **2%** statewide. 2022

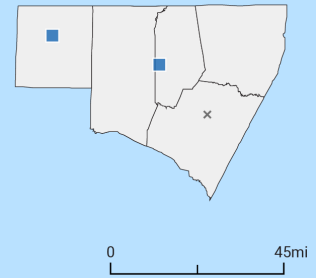

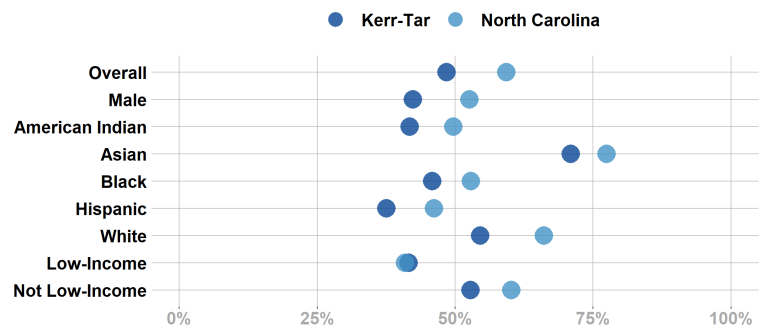

Postsecondary Enrollment Rates in Kerr-Tar WDB, 2022

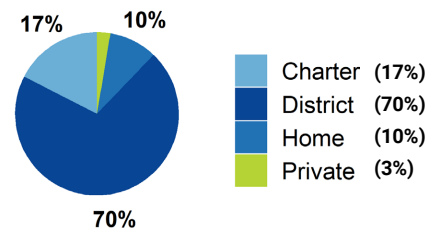

Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Kerr-Tar completed **4,789 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (industry-valued credential data available in Spring 2024) and 953 concentrations** in 2022. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources; Human Services; and Architecture and Construction.

 **369 high school students** took at least one **AP course (5%)** versus **15%** in the state (2022).

 **633 high school students** participated in **Career & College Promise programs (19%)** versus **23%** in the state (2022).
