

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# Success of Piedmont Triad Regional High School Graduates

- 81% of students who enroll **persist to their second year** versus 83% for the state. 2022
- 59% of students who enroll earn a degree or certificate within 6 years versus 59% for the state. 2022





#### 62% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 1,950 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%. 2023

- 80% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 74% in the state. 2022
- 56% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

# How students in Piedmont Triad Regional traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Piedmont Triad Regional needs:

- 45% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 1,907 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 27% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 32,980 more needed to meet state goal of **73%**. 2023
- 32% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **math**, compared to **35%** statewide; 38,697 more needed to meet state goal of **86%**. 2023
- 86% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 1,102 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 31% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 33,088 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



#### **School Choice**

197,569 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Piedmont Triad Regional in the 2022-23 school year.

#### **Access to Postsecondary Credits**

Students in Piedmont Triad Regional completed **45,672 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (8,586 (19%) were industry-valued credentials) and 7,967 concentrations** in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Health Science; and Agricultural, Food, & Natural Resources.



**5,791 high school students** took at least one **AP test (12%)** versus **16%** in the state (2023).



**3,503 high school students** participated in **Career & College Promise programs (31%)** versus **36%** in the state (2023).
