







• 60% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2023, compared to 62% statewide; 484 more need to complete in 2023 to meet state goal of 80%.

- · 66% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 74% in the state, 2022
- 48% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 58% in the state. 2022

How students in Turning Point traditional schools are currently doing:

To meet state goals, each year Turning Point needs:

- 50% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program, compared to 53% statewide; 481 more needed to meet state goal of 75%. 2023
- 20% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in **reading**, compared to **30%** statewide; 8,708 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2023
- 20% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math, compared to 35% statewide; 10,726 more needed to meet state goal of 86%, 2023
- 82% of 9th graders graduate within four years, compared to 87% statewide; 391 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2023
- 32% of students are chronically absent from school, compared to 27% statewide; 7,855 less needed to meet state goal of 11%. 2023



Access to Postsecondary Credits

Students in Turning Point completed 9,516 Career & Technical Education (CTE) credentials (1,315 (14%) were industry-valued credentials) and 2,048 concentrations in 2023. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Human Services; Business Management & Administration; and Health Science.



778 high school students took at least one AP test (8%) versus 16% in the state (2023)



1,230 high school students participated in Career & College Promise programs (45%) versus 36% in the state (2023).
